





We recognize that not all of our students are able to come to our downtown studios, so we tailor our programming to go on the road. Through community partnerships, students who are in treatment facilities, foster care, and living in the more remote and rural parts of our community have access to our award winning programming.

K-12 In-School/Statewide Programming

Our In-School programs brings teaching artists to a single classroom, grade level, or an entire school across the state of Utah. We offer programs that introduce students to the language and concepts of the media arts through an interactive experience. 156 students recorded a song during Open Mic, our Friday drop-in program run by the audio apprenticeship students.





Community Program Highlight: Super Sweet Friday Mornings



Since 2007, Spy Hop has been partnering with the Salt Lake Division of Youth Services for an amazing, creative Friday morning multimedia workshop that runs the entire school year. Each time students from the DYS Boys and Girls Group Home enter Spy Hop they have two hours to create a short film, podcast, or stop-motion animation piece based on learning social skills, positive life lessons, personal reflections or a wacky science fact. When the two hours are up, the outcome is usually an entertaining and enlightening piece of collaborative media, lots of smiles, and high-fives from mentors and teenagers. This is why we call the program Super Sweet Friday Mornings.

New Program Highlight: Voices of the West



Spy Hop was awarded \$240,000 in funding from the renowned **John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation** to pilot a new program titled **Voices of the West**, *Stories from Utah Youth*. **Voices of the West** is an 18-month project to bring Spy Hop's youth media programs to three rural regions of Utah - San Juan County, Tooele County, and the Uinta Basin. Through after-school and

summer media workshops as well as educator training, this project empowers Utah youth through digital literacy and the media arts to foster a more informed and robust participatory media culture in rural Utah. The MacArthur Foundation's support demonstrates our collective belief that young people have powerful stories to tell and that their voices matter.
