Spy Hop seeks a full-time / in-person **Community Programs Media Arts Mentor** dedicated to youth development, media arts, and progressive education to teach media arts programming to youth ages 9-19 throughout the state of Utah. This position requires a desire to travel the state as well as experience in **film production and editing.** Other media related skills in digital design tools and techniques / video game design and production / illustration and animation / audio production / electronic music composition and beatmaking may qualify for this position as well. If you thrive in a creative environment and have a strong artistic voice with a passion to convey Spy Hop's mission in artistically compelling and original ways, this position is for you.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide consistent full-time mentorship of students while encouraging self-expression, the setting of goals, and the recognition of student's artistic identities.
- Travel the state of Utah presenting programs in public schools, working with the Statewide Arts Director to deliver Spy Hop programming.
- Assist in the planning and facilitation of statewide arts workshops and assemblies as needed by the Statewide Arts Director and Director of Learning Design, traveling to 4-5 districts a year.
- Facilitate teaching Spy Hop's rural storytelling film apprenticeship, Voices of The West, traveling to 4 locations every summer, for a total of 4 weeks.
- Facilitate teaching Spy Hop's after school Media Clubs in partnership with Salt Lake City School District to provide engaging arts experiences for middle school students.
- Facilitate teaching seasonal Youth in Care programs as needed or directed.
- Design and implement dynamic curriculum for a variety of community-based programs locally and across the state in collaboration with the Director of Learning Design.
- Collect and report demographic data for students served according to Spy Hop protocol in collaboration with the Programs Coordinator.
- Administer program evaluation and assessment tools (focus groups, student interviews).



• Assist development team as needed with program narrative, donor recruitment, funder recognition, and student-produced media.

- Prior experience working with youth.
- Can work collaboratively, give & receive constructive feedback, has a willingness to learn.
- Experience in developing engaging project-based programming for diverse groups of youth.
- Extensive experience in film production, digital design or audio production.
