Position Overview

Spy Hop is seeking a full-time Film Mentor to join their fun, creative, and passionate team, helping young people find their voice, tell their stories, and effect positive change in their lives, their communities, and the World. The **Film Mentor** position focuses on designing and implementing dynamic film curriculum for the PitchNic (nonfiction) film program, Reel Stories, Watch This, and beginner film Foundational classes. This position reports directly to the In-House Program Director and plays a vital role in Spy Hop's film department. The Film Mentor focuses on supporting both advanced film students engaged in year-long productions and introductory classes for youth experiencing Spy Hop for the first time. Experience working with young people of various age groups is highly valued.

The role of a Spy Hop mentor is to encourage self-expression, setting goals, developing a sense of resilience, and recognizing students' artistic identities. This includes creating dynamic learning activities, as well as planning, producing, and assisting with student showcases. Additionally, it involves helping students transition into academic, artistic, or vocational opportunities by providing resources such as resumes, letters of recommendation, portfolios, scholarship information, and internship opportunities. Additionally, this position will collaborate with other staff members to ensure the delivery of high-quality programs and provide students with transformative artistic experiences.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Teach a full-time roster of filmmaking classes for youth ages 9-19
- Participate in the building and implementation of a dynamic filmmaking curriculum
- Provide consistent full-time mentorship to students.
- Participate in outreach events to recruit students to classes.
- Identify, select, and oversee peer mentors to assist in intermediate and advanced classes.
- Track daily attendance and ensure that accurate data is collected.
- Administer all required evaluation and assessment tools. Complete all end-of-class elements including: final projects, program evaluation, class photographs, archiving, and class wrap discussions.
- Assist the Development team as needed with program narrative, donor recruitment, funder recognition, and student-produced media.
- Work with the Lab Assitant and In-House Programs Director to ensure archiving of student work from all film programs in a timely manner.
- Maintain all equipment and classrooms associated with film programming.

- Manage independent lab time for post-production and editing of films.
- Manage peer mentor stipend hours and report to the Finance Director for payroll.
- Track and manage program budgetsbuild and maintain relationships with professionals in the film industry, including artist collaborators, student portfolio reviewers, professional actors, and vendors
- Assist the Marketing team with special program screening events and content creation needs.
- Collaborate with Marketing to produce internal photo and video content for use at events, benefits, in emails, on the website, and social media (ie, Annual Benefit, program promotion, block party, student showcases, outreach assets, etc.)

- College degree in film/digital media and/or 3-5 years of experience working in the film industry and/or teaching all aspects of documentary filmmaking: storytelling, production, post-production, and distribution.
- Experience working with youth (ages 9-19).
- Demonstrated human relations and effective communication skills required.
